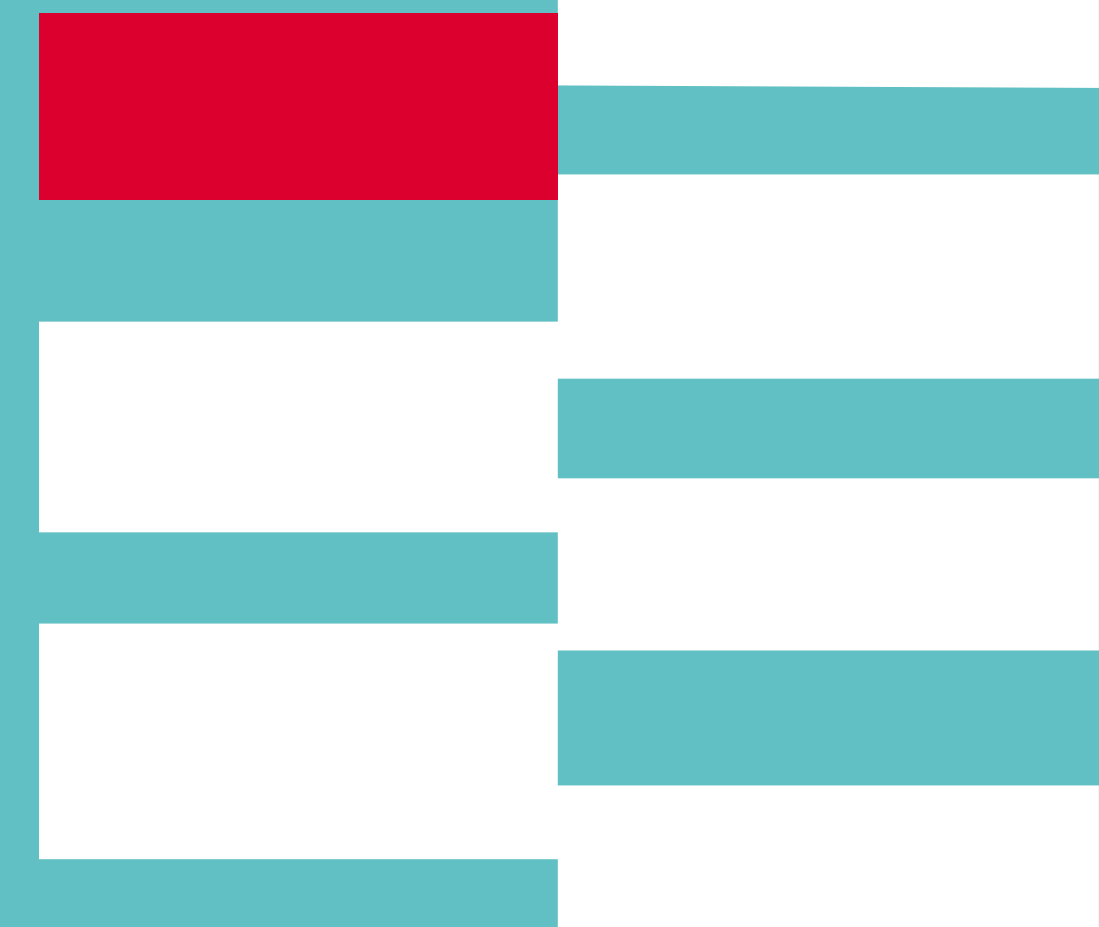

O' Week

The Orientation Week (O' Week) commences at 8:30 am on Monday 31 August 2026.

- Meet your Course Coordinator who will provide expert advice on your Study Plan
- Meet MIT staff and fellow commencing students within your course
- Learn how to access MIT systems including Moodle and AMS
- Learn more about the MIT Library and IT services
- Discuss the course progression and attendance requirements
- Learn about your obligations and rights
- Enroll in your courses and finalise your Timetable (Orientation is compulsory for all new students)

Enrolment means officially becoming an MIT student.

Course enrolments will take place on campus during Orientation Week. You will receive an appointment card with date & time to commence your enrolment process, including meeting with your Course Coordinator to receive your study plan before you enrol and create your timetable

If you hold a conditional offer, have any exemptions, or you are an onshore applicant, you are required to submit the following documents prior to enrolling. You must bring your original documents at the time of enrolment and document submission.

- Appointment Card
- Passport
- Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE)
- Academic Transcripts from Year 11 and 12 onwards
- IELTS or equivalent English test result
- Original copies of all previous academic qualifications
- Overseas Students Health Cover (OSHC) certificate

MIT's Learning Management System
Moodle is a Learning Platform and assists with effective course management and personalised learning. Within this system you will find Orientation information, event registrations, unit descriptions and your weekly study material

AMS

Academic Management System
AMS helps with online enrolments and timetable management. Appointments can also be made with academic staff via this system.

Academic Progress

The academic progress of each student enrolled at MIT is governed by MIT's Student Academic Progress Policy and Procedure. An enrolled student has maintained satisfactory academic progress in a trimester when they complete the academic requirements at a satisfactory level by:

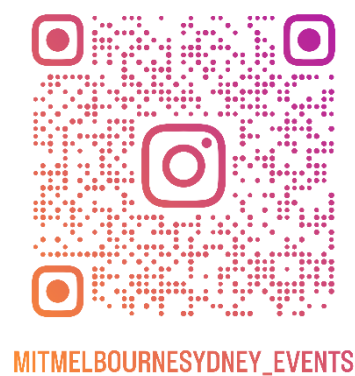
1. Passing more than 50% of the credit points in which the student is enrolled in the trimester.
2. Maintain a rate of academic progress that enables them to complete their course within the maximum period of study defined by the Academic Board and
3. Satisfying the requirements of any compulsory placements in their course.
